
Going to Agganis Arena

The person working at the ticket office can let us know where to go and how to find our seats.


I will use my ticket to get into the building.

There are many restrooms I can use.




The restrooms in the Main Lobby do not have automatic hand dryers.

The Sensory Room is quiet and there are sitting areas and fidget toys available to use to take a break. There is a TV in the room that only shows the hockey game so we can determine when is a good time to try again.

If we decide not to go back to the event, a worker outside of the room can let us know how to exit.
